What Does Our Board Do?

The Rocky Christian School Society has been around since the 1950s. A group of faithful Christian people met regularly back then planning for the day that Rocky might be home to a school where the teaching was consistent with that of a Christian home. By 1970, the Society successfully established Rocky Christian School. Now, 48 years after opening our doors, our school is still alive and well. How did that happen? Obviously, our work has been blessed by God and the glory belongs to Him. But it would be wrong of us to fail to recognize the visionary people who believed with all the conviction they could muster that Rocky needed a Christian School.

When we think of the visionaries in our history, it might be tempting to first think of principals and teachers who have ministered powerfully within these walls. But the truth of the matter is that the primary guardians of the mission and vision of our beautiful little school is the Board of Rocky Christian School Society. It is the Board which, on your behalf, makes every effort to ensure that the education that children receive at Rocky Christian School is Biblical and is directed towards the Christian life that we desire for our children. It is the Board which is entrusted with the task to build the collection of families who enroll children in this school into a community, united by a singular purpose.

In 2012, after over 40 years of operating as an independent school, Rocky Christian School became an alternative program in the Wild Rose School Division. Many of the responsibilities of the society Board, including provision of transportation and the employment of teachers, were assumed by the school division. However the most important job, protecting our mission and vision, remains the core work of our Board.

The agreement between the Rocky Christian School Society and the Wild Rose School Division includes these paragraphs:

Wild Rose recognizes and supports the commitment of the Society in ensuring the availability of a program of studies for students whose parents desire an educational setting which operates in accordance with the beliefs, mission, core values, vision, theological commitments, ethical standards and educational philosophy of the Society.

The important and legitimate role of the society in helping ensure that the integrity and intent of the RCS Program, as described in the Program Vision and Mission, is recognized and supported by Wild Rose.

It is the Rocky Christian School Society Board which protects those things on your behalf. It is no less important today that they understand what a Christian education is than it was in 1970. In fact it may be more important today. As Christian Schools of all types encounter political pressure to diminish our biblical foundation in favour of more secular orthodoxies, the Board must know what we believe and be prepared to devoutly stand up for our right to adhere to Biblical Christianity in all areas of life including the education of our children.

Please get to know the Board. Encourage them in their work. Consider answering the call if you are ever asked to stand for nomination. Discuss Christian education often. It is a precious gift that we must be prepared to defend when the storms come. I wish to thank Peggy Hondebrink (chair), Amber Boodt, Jessica Hoeksema, Victoria Brettelle, Johann Jeppe, Alida VanGinkel, and James Smid for their willingness to take on this important leadership role, and for their commitment to advance the purpose of Christian Education in the Rocky/Clearwater area. Be sure to encourage them, and pray for them.

NOTES FROM THE OFFICE

We had a really good turn out for our registration evening at the end of August; thank you to all who came to get their registration paperwork taken care of prior to the start of school! If you were away or otherwise unable to attend that evening, please be sure to stop by the office to fill out any necessary registration papers and update your contact information.

School Fees Update

As you may be aware, our regular school fees ($$40 \sim K-6$; $$70 \sim 7-9$) have been eliminated in accordance with new provincial guidelines.

Sport fees for this year are:

- Volleyball ~ \$20.00
- Cross Country ~ \$6.00
- Hockey ~ \$100.00—subject to change according to sponsorship
- Basketball ~ \$20.00
- ◆ Badminton ~ \$15.00

Additionally, RCS students who take care of scorekeeping, timing, and officiating at our games will no longer be paid for those activities. However, their hours will count against the volunteer hour requirement for your family. We do want our students to learn the joy of volunteering for a good cause!

Field Trip fees are difficult to pre-determine as admission fees, activity fees, bussing, etc. are subject to change each year. You will receive notes well in advance from your child's teacher regarding any field trip plans and fees that are associated. If at any time these fees are difficult to pay, please speak to the office to make arrangements.

All school related fees can now be paid online using a program called School Cash Online. You can link to School Cash on our website. Using school cash you can pay for fees for all of your children registered in Wild Rose Schools in one easy transaction. Please be advised that all fees contain a 1.5% district processing fee for payments relating to the processing of credit card charges. It should be noted that the DO Processing fee is only a partial cost recovery, and will not cover all of the online costs (which will be paid for by Division Office).

You may pay per month (\$3/student/month) or you can pre-pay for the full year (\$24.00/student). The "Pay it Forward" option is to help make sure that every student in our school can take part in our Hot Lunch program; if you would like to help make hot lunch more affordable for students who may not be able to pay for it, feel free to



mark that box and send in a little extra money to help cover the cost. Please be sure to send in your forms before the due date each month so that we have accurate numbers for the wonderful volunteers who prepare the meals for us and the appropriate amount of milk can be ordered.

Moo Club will soon begin!!

As part of a healthy lunch, many students will receive milk on the days they've ordered for. If they are absent, parents may keep track of how many days and deduct the value of the milk for that many days from their next month's order. They may also consider it a donation to the school. Also, if you know your child(ren) will be absent in the coming month, you can calculate that in on your payment; please write on the form how many days you are paying for and the dates that they will be absent.

Hot lunch days are not included on the milk order forms; if you want your student to have milk on hot lunch days, you must order it on the hot lunch form even if your students doesn't want the meal.

We will be collecting Shoeboxes for **Operation Christmas Child** again this year. We would love to see our school fill 100 Shoeboxes!

Volunteer Requirements

Just a guick recap of what is required to volunteer in our school:

- ◆ Criminal Record Check & Intervention Record Check must be on file at the school
 - please note that a criminal record does not automatically disqualify someone from volunteering at the school. In the case of a volunteer showing a criminal record, in consultation with senior leadership and based on the individual case, permission may be granted to allow volunteerism, with specific duties. eg: a drunk driving conviction would not disqualify someone from volunteering as a chaperone on a field trip but would not be appropriate as a volunteer driver

The following is required to be a volunteer **driver** for any situation where parents might be driving students other than their own children. This is primarily for extra-curricular activities:

- A current (within 12 months) Driver's abstract must be on file at the school
 - drivers with more than 6 demerits are not permitted to drive on school sponsored activities
 - The school will cover the cost of obtaining Driver's Abstracts. Bring in your receipt and we will reimburse you.
- Proof of a minimum of \$1,000,000 liability insurance coverage on file at the school.




MY TRIP TO THE FORT
