Blessed are the Peacemakers

There's not too much peace in the world these days. Maybe we are not at war, but that probably depends on what you mean by war. It seems like the whole world is in a war of words.

The Bible has a lot to say about peace. The word 'peace' appears 249 times in the New International Version. It appears 420 times in the King James Version. I'm not sure what to make of that.

Between the political left and the political right I hear a lot of name-calling these days. People get insulted for wearing masks and for not wearing them. It's not very peaceful out there.

I've been thinking about that one Beatitude in Matthew 5:9, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." How shall I do that? Some people will argue that the more appropriate passage for today is in verse 11, "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me." How shall I go about being a peacemaker in this day and age? I suppose at least part of the answer is found in the fact that you cannot just pick one Beatitude and run with it. It's not a shopping list. The Beatitudes, in its entirety, is a picture of the predisposition that a Christian ought to carry with him or her as we walk, particularly in troubled times.

As I was contemplating this business of how to be a peacemaker, one of our teachers mentioned Romans 12:18; "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone."

As far as it depends on me, I have a responsibility to live at peace with everyone.

But there is a problem. I have opinions ... about masks ... and politics ... and just about everything else. I know that some of my opinions, if expressed, will provoke a reaction. Today's world is not a safe place for expressing opinions. People will call me names. Should I express my opinions anyway? Maybe not. What would my purpose be?

What if we built safe places for people who disagree with us? What if we showed interest in what they had to say? What if we could disagree respectfully and contend for our own positions while speaking the truth in love? What if we as Christians could distinguish ourselves from all of the people hurling insults at one another?

Our children are watching us. We are their models for living a Christian life. As the world increasingly becomes a place where people freely hate those we disagree with, how will we distinguish ourselves as people who love our enemies? How will we distinguish ourselves as people who love our enemies? How will we distinguish ourselves as people who live at peace with everyone, at least as far as it depends on us?

SKATING CLASS


