The Best Ever Trip to Bethlehem

Every year around this time we all go to Bethlehem. Maybe with all of the travel restrictions and rules about gathering, you are thinking of putting the trip off this year. After all, you have heard the cry on social media and from among your friends that Christmas has been stolen from us this year. Can it be true? Is it possible?

Every year when we sing "O Little Town of Bethlehem" we take a virtual tour of this most precious city, lying still. Each year we are reassured anew by the everlasting light that shines in its streets. We sing "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in Thee tonight!" If we really mean it, maybe this year we need Bethlehem more than ever. Furthermore, in this year of virtual everything, what better time to go to Bethlehem?

We probably all lament that family Christmas celebrations will be diminished this year. But as I sing, "How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given, so God imparts to human hearts the blessings of His heaven." I am reminded that Christmas does not consist in, or depend on the joyful noise of a family gathering. As long as God imparts blessings, Christmas cannot be stolen from us. While pondering this year's tour of Bethlehem I was reminded of the chorus of Carolyn Arends song, "Is Bethlehem Too Far Away?" where she sings:

AT HOME LEARNING

JAN.

The provincial government has announced that **January 4-8**, **2021** will be a week of remote learning for all students. This will be a Teacher-Directed program which will, in most cases, require an adult to monitor student progress.

Parents can expect communication from teachers about what digital, paper, and/or projects they will expect from students during this week. **It is essential that students actively engage in the at-home learning program** in order to not fall behind.

Our hope is that students will meet provincial curricular outcomes and Rocky Christian School outcomes as selected by the classroom teacher. **In most cases we believe this can be accomplished in two to four hours per day at home**. If your child appears to be doing less than that, please contact the teacher early in the week. Assigned work can be accomplished with the class during Google Meet times set by the teacher, or on your own at a time that best fits your family.


Many teachers will offer a daily video conference Google Meet to check in with students and to share instruction or offer extra help. School staff will be available 8:30 am - 3:30 pm daily during the week. The school also remains open with a few staff in the building if you need to pick up anything or need to phone.

If your child's teacher offers to send Chromebooks home, please note:

- Most of these are brand new Chromebooks (unlike the end-of-life Chromebooks that were sent home in March).
- These Chromebooks have a replacement value of \$350.
- In a school setting, we would never allow students on a Chromebook unsupervised. In a school setting, we treat the Chromebook as a tool for learning, creating, and publishing. It is never a toy. We ask parents to expect the same.
- If you do not have a computer at home available for student use, please check with each teacher regarding their specific plans for ChromeBook distribution.

If your child has difficulties connecting via the Google Classroom, please speak with their teachers. There are a number of ways they can help. Just speak with them. If you are struggling to maintain a reliable internet connection while your child is studying from home, the "Telus for Good" program may be for you. It provides internet service for \$9.95 per month for low income families for up to two years. Interested families can learn more at <u>https://tinyurl.com/yes7z9mb</u>.
