

### Memo

Re: ROCKY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL VOLUNTEER COVID PROCESSES

To: PARENTS AND VOLUNTEERS

When we return to school on January 5 new rules regarding Covid-19 screening for volunteers will come into force. While the school division has eased some of the procedures that we are required to follow, the new rules are going to involve a degree of inconvenience.

We understand completely that some will find the imposition of such rules to be unjust. **My request is that, in spite of whatever you may be feeling about these procedures, please do not stop volunteering your time at the school.** To do so only hurts the kids, and they are not the ones who anyone is upset with.

I've tried to summarize the rules here:

### If you are Vaccinated

Show your QR Code to the principal for verification.

It can be kept on file at the school.

### If you are Unvaccinated

Volunteers must be tested no more than 72 hours prior to any school activity that involves contact with students.

- a. Watch this Rapid Response COVID-19 Antigen Rapid Test training video
- b. Self-administer the Covid-19 test. This can be done at the school or at home.
- c. Show the results or a photo of the results to the principal.

A negative test is required in order to volunteer.

### **Test Availability**


- 1. Supplied by the School
  - A. The principal will have a supply of tests in his office which can be administered at the school.
  - B. If you are a frequent volunteer the principal can give you a box of 5 tests
  - C. We have a limited supply but will try to get more as we need them

### 2. Free, Publicly Available Kit

- A. Similar to those supplied to schools.
- B. Please make full use of free kits in order to reduce strain on school-based test kits.
- C. Availability appears to be limited as many people have rushed out to snatch up all of the available tests.
- 3. You can also purchase a test at a local pharmacy

### Additional Notes:

- **The Pool:** We always need a number of volunteers when students from the lower grade (K-3) go to the pool. Volunteers are asked to stop by the school 30 minutes prior to going to the pool to either show evidence of vaccinations, show the principal a rapid test result, or take a rapid test. Test results are available 15 to 20 minutes after a nasal swab.
- **Athletics:** In most cases coaches will be eligible to receive test kits containing five tests, and therefore can conduct tests at home. Game officials who require a rapid test ought to arrive at the school 30 minutes prior to game time.
