<u>Community</u>

The proverb, "It takes a village to raise a child, " has been expressed in many ways over the centuries. Some people believe the saying originated in an ancient African proverb while others contend it came from a North American tribe. Versions of the proverb from various tribes include, "A child does not grow up only in a single home," "A child belongs not to one parent or home," and "Regardless of a child's biological parent(s) its upbringing belongs to the community." Many Christian parents will cringe a little at the prospect of sharing their children to the degree suggested by these proverbs. However, we cannot escape the fact that **our children are nurtured and encouraged by many people**. Unlike the African or North American tribes from whom the proverb originated, parents today make choices about the community which will raise their children. Our community is like a modern-day Christian tribe. Who will you allow into your village?

A majority of Rocky Christian School parents have chosen to live in a rural setting. The decision to live in the country is, at least in part, a decision about the community that will raise your child. Signing up for minor sports or a club is a decision about the community that you consent to raise your children with you. The degree to which you decide to participate in your church and school communities is a set of decisions about the community that you. Who do you depend on to live in the same village as your children?

Hebrews 10:24 & 25 (NIV) says, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching." At the heart of the passage is the injunction to keep meeting together, or as expressed in other translations, "Do not forsake our assembly", "Do not neglect church meetings", "Do not avoid worshipping together", and "Do not forget to gather as a community." But we should be careful not to miss the purpose and character of that community. Our children must live in a community where we "Spur one another on toward love and good deeds" and encourage one-another. Again, other translations of this passage are helpful as a Christian community is described as a place where we "Provoke unto charity and to good works," (DRA) "Comfort one another," (NLV) "Outdo each other in being helpful and kind to each other and in doing good," (TBL) "See how inventive we can be in encouraging love and helping out," (MSG) and "Inspire each other to greater love and to righteous deeds." (VOICE) We and our children are intended, and indeed instructed by God to live in a community like that. With our brothers and sisters in Christ we form a village like that!

Our children will be raised by a community. By their actions parents will choose that community. You can try to avoid it by sheltering them from everybody but trusted family members if, in the words of our passage, you, "give up meeting together." Look at any child and you will see signs of the village that is raising them. Are the children left to raise each other on the streets of the village or are they being spurred on and encouraged towards good deeds and love? Rocky Christian School seeks to be the kind of village where we seek to "outdo each other in being helpful and kind." It is not a village of children 'only', but rather a place where **we are deliberate about being a community in which one generation is connected to the next**. It is not a village of children 'alone', but rather one of fellowship, where children and adults encourage and inspire each other towards loving and helping one another. It is a community that invites Christian families like yours.
