It contained an unsigned three page note expressing kind words about surviving the 'forks' of the past couple of years. Among the explanations of how the fork would be an appropriate metaphor for the times in which we live was this story:

A woman was diagnosed with terminal illness and given three months to live. She asked her preacher to come by her house to discuss her final wishes. She told him which songs she wanted sung at the service, what scriptures to read, and what dress she wanted to be buried in. She also requested to be buried with her favourite Bible

As he prepared to leave, she suddenly remembered one more thing. "I have one more request," she said excitedly.

"What's that?" the preacher replied.

"This is very important," she continued. "I want to be buried with a fork in my right hand."

The preacher looked at her, not knowing quite what to say. "That surprises you?" she asked.

"To be honest, I am puzzled," he replied.
