The Rocky Christian School Mission Statement affirms that we are a non-denominational community of Christian believers. We deliberately seek to be the school of choice for every Bible-believing, church-attending family in the Rocky Mountain House, Clearwater County area. I think this is a well kept secret. It's an accidental secret. Christians in Rocky Mountain House don't know this about our school. It is assumed that since many of the people who founded this school were from one particular denomination, the school supports that perspective.

When Rocky Christian School opened its doors in 1970, it is probably true that we had a lot to learn about being non-denominational. Today 1 think we can say that we are pretty good at it.

While church denominations have doctrines regarding such things as baptism, end-times, tongues-speaking, alcohol use, heaven and hell, the nature and essence of God, the authority of scripture, sanctification, prophecy, etc. Rocky Christian School seeks to be respectful of all of the positions that Bible-Believing Christians might hold.

One of the things we have tried to do, and will continue to do more frequently is to invite pastors, two or three at a time, to visit our grade 8 & 9 class, and make a Biblical argument for a position that Christians disagree about. At the end of the presentation the presenters will turn to one another and affirm their unity in Christ. Students will come to understand and respect the positions of Christians that are different from their own. In doing so, students will make their Christianity their own, and at the same time come to understand that the unity of the Body of Christ is not found in our uniformity.

For years our board and promotion committee members have been asking themselves the question, "Why do we attract families from some denominations, but not from others?" I don't know the answer to that question. We have, at one time or another, had students registered in our school who come from practically every church in town. But we always seem to fall short of our goal of being the school of choice for every Christian family in town. I think it is at least partly because of our accidental secret.

So how about we begin a campaign where we whisper into the ears of every Christian we know, "You wanna know a secret? Rocky Christian School is a non-denominational school that respects and celebrates the theological positions of every Bible-Believing Church-Attending Christian in town!" If enough people share the secret, maybe it won't be a secret any longer.
